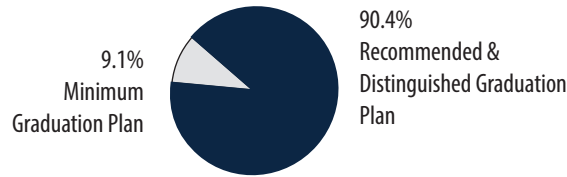

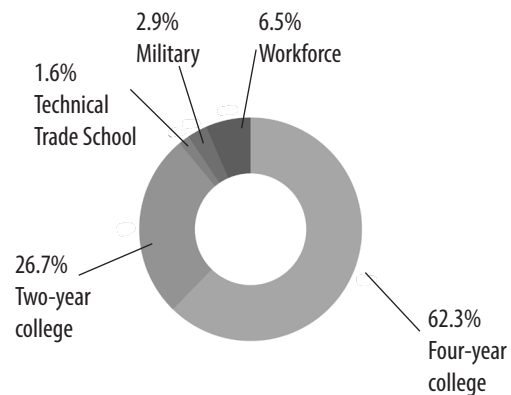
Student Opportunities

Grade Point Average & Class Rank

All semester course grades with the exception of local courses, correspondence courses, credits by exam, summer school courses, courses prior to ninth grade, and Eagle Academy courses (computer aided curriculum) are included in GPA and class rank.

For a student to earn credit in a semester course, the semester grade must be a minimum of 70. For a student to earn credit for a course that is a full year in length, the average of the two semester grades must equal a minimum of 70. Grade points are awarded based upon the grade earned and the designation of the course as on level, Pre-AP/IB, Dual Credit or AP/IB. Rank in class is determined on the basis of semester grades earned in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12.

Rank in class is based on the weighted GPA. GPA is determined (on a weighted 5.0 scale) by dividing the total number of grade points earned by the number of approved courses taken each semester. Rank in class is determined by arranging a high-to-low ranking of all GPAs in a class.

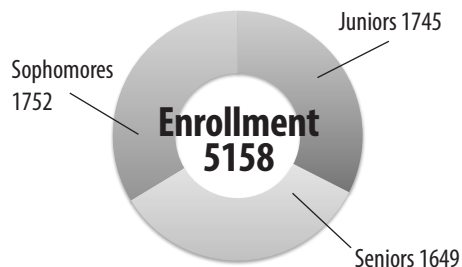

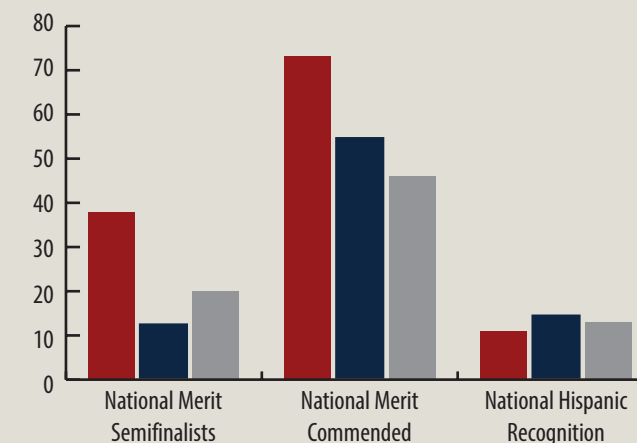
