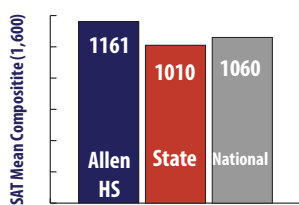

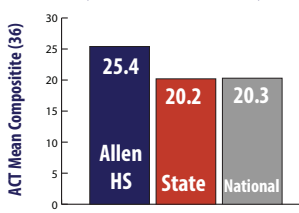

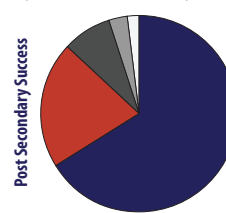

Grade Point Average

Grade Scale: 100-90=A, 89-80=B, 79-70=C, 69 and below=F

Grade Point Average Calculation

GPA points are awarded to a student who averages a one or two semester grade to a minimum of a 70. A grade point is awarded based off the designation of the course: On-Level, Advanced, Dual Credit, AP/IB.

The calculation of GPA and class rank shall exclude grades earned in summer school (exception dual credit); any traditional correspondence course; any on-line course; any local credit course; any audited course, courses taken prior to 9th grade, and grades earned through credit by examination.

Students with a final GPA over 4.0 will have grades that are on the 4.0 scale earned in the fall and spring of their senior year excluded from their GPA if the credits are not required for graduation or to earn an endorsement.

About Allen ISD

Allen ISD is a nationally recognized public school district providing outstanding educational opportunities for elementary and secondary students. Student enrollment in Allen ISD sits at 21,000 in grades prekindergarten to 12th. Students attend 18 elementary schools, three middle schools, one freshmen center, and one high school. Additionally, Allen ISD opened a STEAM Center in 2019 which welcomes students of all grade levels to experience hands-on science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics instructional opportunities. Allen ISD also partnered with Collin College in 2020 to open a Dual Credit exclusive facility for AHS students that is located adjacent to the STEAM Center.

Allen High School boasts a 97% graduation rate and sends more than 90% of its graduates to post-secondary educational opportunities. Allen High School offers a wide variety of Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), Dual-Credit, and Career and Technology (CTE) opportunities.

The CTE department offers courses in 13 career clusters of study including Culinary Arts, Nursing Science, and Business Management to name a few. AHS offers an on-campus, student run store, the Eagle Edge, that allows students to design merchandise and maintain the daily operations of a small business. In 2020, AHS partnered with the Credit Union of Texas (CUTX) to provide students financial literacy curriculum and to open a student run bank in the main hall of the AHS campus.

A robust Fine Arts Department saw 17 musicians receive All-State Honors with two middle school and two high school orchestras winning national recognition in 2022. The district Athletic Department is also excelling with state championships in football, boys basketball, wrestling, and girls golf in the last five years. The wrestling team has won the boys' state title for 12 years running and captured its first girls title in 2021. AHS volleyball, baseball, soccer, softball, tennis, and swimming and diving are always district competitive teams.
