Project Purpose	
What is the problem, need, or opportunity that this grant will address? Explain what students will know and be able to do as a result of this project and/or how a problem will be addresses and/or how a situation improved because of the grant. (500 words or less.)	
<p>This project will address the student need to function as independently as possible both in the home and the community upon exiting from the public school system. The students learn best through real life, hands-on, functional learning experiences. As a result of the "Working Toward Independence" project, students will gain valuable skills and develop independence in all areas of daily living. Specifically, students will participate in all areas of meal preparation including meal planning, grocery shopping, cooking, and clean-up. They will learn about proper nutrition and a healthy lifestyle. They will also learn basic budgeting/money skills and laundry skills. The students will learn skills necessary to order from a menu, interact with restaurant employees, and demonstrate appropriate manners and behaviors in both fast food and sit-down restaurants. As a result of these experiences, the students will learn vital skills necessary for living as independently as possible in their community. The ultimate goal of my project is to improve upon the level of independence of my students, making it possible for each student to participate more fully in their home life and all community experiences.</p>	
Project Description	
How will the project or program be implemented? Describe activities and tasks. Who is the target population and in what ways will they benefit? (500 words or less.)	

The students will need funding for grocery shopping at a neighborhood grocery store. They will need funding for consumables such as napkins, paper towels, dish soap, and laundry detergent. They will need funding for outings to fast food restaurants and sit-down restaurants.

Proposed instructional activities and tasks include the following:

- Plan healthy meals/snacks, make grocery lists from simple menu/recipe, grocery shop (locate items, learn layout of store, read aisle headings, display appropriate behavior, ask for help when needed, interact with employees, compare prices, check out (including use of self-scan check out), use wallet and handle money to pay for groceries, take receipt, solve problem situations that may arise

- Store food in the appropriate location, understand about expiration dates, read simple recipe or follow picture recipe to prepare food/drink, set table, serve food, practice social skills with peers

- Perform kitchen clean-up

- Use appliances safely (oven, microwave, dishwasher, blender, hand mixer, toaster)

- Order from menu in fast food/sit-down restaurants, follow procedures for each setting including interacting with employees, displaying appropriate manners, paying for meals, tipping wait staff, and solving problem situations

The students who will participate in this program are students in the Functional Academics program at AHS. These students qualify for Special Education services because of an Intellectual Disability or Autism. In addition, some students may have vision/auditory impairments, speech/language impairments or other health impairments such as cerebral palsy.

Benefits of this program include increasing each student's ability to function in the community and home to the maximum extent possible as well as improved social skills and self-esteem. As a result of increased participation of the student in family domestic and community activities, parents will realize their child's potential and will have greater expectations of them. Finally, the entire Allen community will benefit through increased awareness of the realistic potential of individuals with disabilities as well as the enjoyment gained through positive interaction with these very special teenagers and young adults.

Each student has an Individual Educational Plan that includes specific, measurable goals and objectives in all instructional areas. The students involved with this project will have goals/objectives specific to Activities of Daily Living and Community-Based Instruction. The effectiveness of this project will be evaluated by student progress toward those goals. This progress is updated every 9 weeks.

Teaching Methods

Students will be provided with hands-on, real-life learning experiences. Instructors will use modeling, prompting, repetition, and re-teaching as needed for student success along with visual cues. Also, positive reinforcement and behavior management strategies will be implemented.

The Special Education Curriculum will be enhanced by Community-Based Instruction and concurrent classroom instruction because the students will be receiving functional instruction in a real-life setting which will more effectively result in the overall goal of increased independence. I have been fortunate enough to have received funding for this program for the past several years and cannot begin to describe the positive outcomes for students and families in terms of increased independence, self-esteem, and more meaningful participation in community life. The impact this funding has had on my students has been truly life-changing.
