Project Purpose

Located 32 miles north of Dallas, Texas, the Allen Independent School District serves a rapidly growing community with more than 20,000 students enrolled in the school district. Lowery Freshman Center is the 9th grade campus for Allen ISD. Students come to Lowery from three middle school campuses; student population includes 14.5% Hispanic, 14.75% Asian, 12% African American, and nearly 13.65% economically disadvantaged.

Beginning in 9th grade, students in Allen can plan a high school career that may include advanced placement classes, technical and career pathways, or an international baccalaureate diploma.

The Native & Heritage Spanish speaking students in Allen ISD face a unique challenge. While they speak both Spanish and English, they often do not possess high level writing, grammar nor spelling skills in Spanish. The Lowery Freshman Center offers a program experience for these students: The Native Speaker Program.

The classes in this program are taught entirely in Spanish and for most of the students, this is the first truly rigorous course they have attempted. Many of these students come from economically disadvantaged homes and do not have the background nor support for taking more rigorous course work. In some cases, their parents did not complete high school and do not have the language skills nor educational ability to support their students in planning high school or college careers.

During the 2012-2013 school year, 16 students were enrolled in the Native Speaker Language Class at Lowery Freshman Center.

Out of the 16 students only 13 students took the Advanced Placement Spanish & Culture exam at the end of the school year. Out of the 13 students, 12 of them met the passing criteria for this exam and receive college credit through the A/P College Board program. This was a very significant step for these students. These students now have college credit ready for them when they finish high school.

During the school year 2014-2015 there were 30 students enrolled in the Native Speaker 3 Pre-AP/ IB and 4 AP courses at the Lowery Freshman Center. Out of these 30 students 21 students took the exam and 95% of them were able to meet the passing criteria as well.

Last school year 2015-2016 22 students took the exam and 10 of them scored the highest possible score. We had 90% of the students meeting the passing criteria for this exam.

The enrollment is expected to grow again for the next school year. We are currently expecting 50 students with the possibility of having more as the school year goes on. Therefore, the class needs to continue with the resources that we have adopted in order to provide the students with a challenging and engaging learning experience. Last year we were awarded a grant and with that money we were able to renew the the online licenses for the students to have access to the Supersite.

Project Description

This project will be implemented throughout the Native Speaker 3 Pre-AP/ IB and 4 AP course. The student's licenses will allow the students to have access to the online resources (textbook and AP preparation materials for the AP Spanish & culture Exam). The students will be utilizing these online resources not only while they are meeting with the instructor face-to-face, but also when they are conducting research and applying the language outside the classroom.

The online resources provided by Vista Higher Learning are great tools for the students because. These tools are authentic resources for Native Speakers of Spanish. The students will be utilizing these resources throughout their interpersonal, interpretative and presentational communication skills while they use the target language.
The target population are students taking the Native Speaker 3 Pre-AP/IB & 4 AP. Most of them are Hispanics.

In addition the students will also have to take the AP Spanish Language and Culture Exam during the last semester of their final year in this course. The test results from this exam will also help us to identify the areas that the students have mastered and what other areas they will need to continue to work on.

Teaching Methods

In regards to the teaching methods that will be used to implement this project, it is our goal in our department, to offer the best learning environment throughout the use of technology.

We will be adopting the necessary resources such as textbooks with online access and additional laptops in order to offer a great learning experience for each student. In addition, we will be providing to our students engaging and meaningful lessons in order for them to develop and master the skills that we will be teaching them in the classroom.

In addition, we will be using our learning management system (Canvas) in order to enhance the learning experience of these students by challenging them with the application of the 21st Century Learning Skills. Students will be able to communicate asynchronously and synchronously not only with their peers, but also with their instructors. The learning environment that we will be providing for these students throughout the duration of this course will not only help them to become more successful students in their upper level classes, but also in their quest of a college or university experience.
