<p>The Movie Project has evolved from a grant received 2 years ago from the Foundation. The Foundation gave us an iPad mini to use to record my Functional English classes as they acted out the Shakespeare play we study each year. Last year, the Movie Project was born as the students participated in performing two children's plays and turning them into movies, in addition to casual classroom performances of Romeo and Juliet. (The Movie Project 2016 can be viewed on Safari Montage). This year, the Movie Project 2017 is titled World History According to FA and the students are working as classes to write and perform their own part of the story. Because we are making a movie, the students can have multiple "takes" to get their lines, as well as closeups: featuring each student is an important part of our performance goal. This grant will help provide basic costuming and props for next year's production, which will be Silent Movies: Fairy Tales.</p>

The target population is the Functional Academics program at AHS. The students get to write, perform, and design sets and costumes. The highlight is the day we invite parents and friends to join us for a movie debut.

The Movie Project presentation to family and friends is a highly anticipated event. Every student looks forward to having their guests come to the debut. They don't even notice how many times we have worked on making sure we have complete sentences in the script, whether the story line flows, or even if we have kept subplots running. But all the elements of writing, of development, and performance are worked on as a natural part of reaching the goal of the presentation. When we return to Shakespeare, or view parts of a movie for a novel, the students are now ready to talk about plot, setting, and characters in a way that was abstract before but has now become practical and concrete. And our parents have seen their students achieving an activity that has not been open to them before. And they will be able to share that activity with relatives by using a password provided by the district to view the Movie Project on a school site.

Teaching Methods

What teaching methods will be used to implement this project? (500 words or less.)

1. Practical involvement of each student in every step of the writing process.
2. Modeling, practice, and interaction to help perform the script.
3. Patience, waiting and respecting the performance time of other students.
4. Performance and audience skills.
5. This project is hands-on, active involvement, active participation, and allows students to be "stars".

The project is designed to start after the Winter Break and the goal is to wrap up all filming by about the end of February. Some of the classes finish sooner, and some later. The timeline accommodates all the needs of the groups. The goal is to have the Movie Project presentation about the first week of April.
