### **Project Purpose**

Purpose: Give students tools to tune their fine motor skills as well a develop greater self-confidence through positive social interactions.

A large number of students are coming to school with far less developed essential skills. Playing with electronic devices and increasing screen time have certainly contributed to children being experts at screen swiping, but have greatly compromised the development of the gross and fine motor skills as well as social interactions. These skills are essential to a students' success in school and in life. Art class provides many opportunities for student to learn about new topics, explore different mediums, and express their experience of the world through their artwork.

Light Boxes are tools that can assist students with drawing, transferring images, tune fine motor skills, develop finger dexterity, and enhance concentration.

Individual and community weaving looms will allow students the opportunity to create a useful and meaningful product with their hands while collaborating with their peers. The primary intention is to promote kindness, understanding, respect, and appreciation for all people from all backgrounds through positive social interaction and shared goals.

### **Project Description**

This project will benefit all students at Olson.

Students will be taught about the value of being able to create tangible products from their own hands. They will be introduced to how light boxes have been used by professional artists. Younger students will learn to use light boxes to aide in simple drawings while older students will it for more complex projects such as animation and flip books.

Students will be introduced to the art of weaving from many cultures throughout history. They will compare and contrast different cultures and their crafts. Students will produce their individual weaving pieces on smaller looms. The community loom will be used by all students as an extension activity to create a large scaled piece for which all students can take pride in its creation.
